Finding a licensed acupuncturist

Options

L.Ac — Licensed Acupuncturist. These letters after someone's name denote that this practitioner has received extensive training in Traditional Acupuncture, which is one part of the holistic medicine system of TCM. Upon earning their degree in Acupuncture, the practitioner must then complete a rigorous board examination process to prove themselves competent in performing acupuncture safely and effectively. Successful completion of these boards results in certification from the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture & Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM). In order to be licensed to practice acupuncture in the State of Ohio, the practitioner must then submit an application with proof of all training & certification to the Ohio Medical Board. Once approved, the practitioner is then legally allowed to place the L.Ac after their name. See here for Ohio's complete list of requirements for Acupuncture Licensure.

Dipl. O.M. — **Diplomate of Oriental Medicine**. In addition to all of the above, someone who has "Dipl. O.M." after their name has completed additional rigorous training, board examination, certification and licensure in Herbal Medicine, which is the internal medicine of TCM.

MSAOM — **Master of Science in Acupuncture & Oriental Medicine**. This refers to the specific degree the practitioner using this designation has earned prior to completing their board examinations, certification, and licensure.

L.OM — **Licensed Oriental Medicine Practitioner**. This designation denotes a Diplomate of Oriental Medicine is fully licensed to practice Oriental Medicine in their state. See here for Ohio's complete list of requirements for Oriental Medicine Licensure.

Western vs Eastern medicine




Western medicine focus is on the Vector or pathogen i.e., Strep Throat



 - Large Intestine (LI), yáng



CLASSIFICATION OF THINGS ACCORDING TO THE THEORY OF THE FIVE ELEMENTS




Physiology

- Bonghan ducts



Acupuncture in the West

Acupuncture in the USA – 1971 James Reston



John Reston, a journalist from the New York Times accompanied Nixon to China in 1971. While in China, Reston required an emergency appendectomy and was treated with acupuncture and moxibustion. After he'd recovered, he toured hospitals in China where acupuncture and moxibustion were being used to help post-operative patients. When he returned to the United States he wrote an article for the NY Times about his experience with traditional Chinese medicine.

Jan 2021: Incarcerated for over 35 years and 9 parole denials even after being diagnosed with life-threatening bone cancer yet denied compassionate release

Nov 2022: Received a parole approval on 11/10/22 at the age of 72

- 1977: Lincoln Hospital closed its clinic to acupuncture school and volunteers; police confiscate all records and claim Dr. Shakur is using both as front for resistance activities.
- 1980: Dr. Shakur establishes Harlem Institute of Acupuncture and begins Black Acupuncture Advisory Association of North America (BAAANA)
- 1981: FBI counterintelligence indicts Dr. Shakur who goes underground
- 1986: Dr. Shakur is arrested, and is held in prison.






